

It is important to our school that all children encounter rich experiences, especially our disadvantaged children. Class teachers meet with children allocated pupil premium funding regularly, to discuss aspirations and diminish any barriers to participation. For example, if a child would like a main part in a school production, school will provide coaching or tuition for the child, so that anticipated barriers are eliminated.
