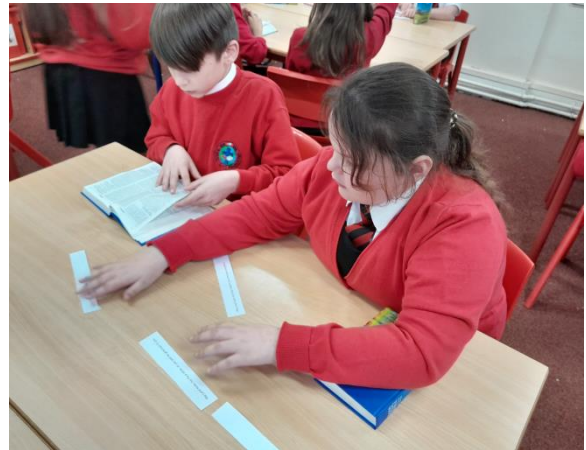
Happy New Year!

In Key Stage 2, pupils were challenged by house leaders to find Bible verses as quickly as possible, and then had other familiar verses to order.

Student Leadership is so important and we are very proud of everyone who took part.



Attendance Policy Changes



There have been several changes to our Attendance Policy this year, in line with other schools in DSAT (our Academy Trust). This is to ensure that we can support with punctuality and attendance as much as possible.

Key changes include:

- First day contact with parents when a pupil doesn't come to school without prior notification. Office staff will call parents after 9.30am if a child is not in school.
- We have always been unable to authorise holidays in term time and we will refer any cases of unauthorised holiday absence that meet Local Authority thresholds for the issuing of a Fixed Penalty Notice, currently £60 per parent/per child for any leave of absence of 5 days or more.

Collective Worship

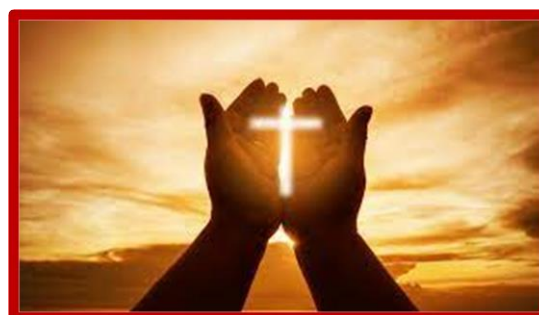

My Happy Mind is our school's preventative program that supports positive mental health and resilience.

Before Christmas we developed the skills of:

- Happy Breathing
- Neuroplasticity
- Strength Spotting

And we can now add a brand new strategy to our toolkits: Attitude for Gratitude.

Pupils have spent the last 5 weeks...

- Learning what gratitude is.
- Learning about all the different ways to express gratitude.
- Learning why gratitude is so important

One quotation we have kept revisiting is:

'Feeling gratitude and not expressing it, is like receiving a present and not opening it.'

A great thing to do at home, especially at the dinner table, is to spend a brief moment reflecting on the day and sharing something you are all grateful for.

This half term we are moving our focus to relationships. Relationships with friends, family and the wider community, and why is it important to have positive relationships in our lives.



Spotlight on... Design and Technology

In Year 6 this half-term, pupils worked closely with children in Year 2 to create their final projects.

First of all children in Miss Widdop's class designed their own amygdala - the part of the brain which helps us with fight or flight response- as part of their My Happy Mind learning about mental health. Then Year 6 children were paired up with a Year 2 child to work for. Pupils met to discuss their ideas and then Mrs Cooper's class put the plans into action.
